
Homer Township Public Library is a community center, technology hub and information warehouse. We work hard to bring the world of information within reach. Discover what the library has to offer you:

Seating is needed! More than ever because residents come in to visit, study, read, look up information, relax, and discuss! More than 600 visitors come in DAILY, and we are continually asked for more seating and meeting space by local residents and groups.



- **600 people** use the Library **EACH DAY!**  
The number of visitors to the Library has **almost doubled** since 1997.
- **757 items** checked out **EACH DAY!**
- **600 times** = the number of times the community room was used last year!

The Library has served the community for the past 21 years with no tax increase and represents 2% of your tax bill.

## RECORD BREAKING RESULTS


Numbers tell the story. This past year alone has seen our checkout of materials increase from almost 200,000 items (600 items daily) to more than **265,000 items (757 items daily)**. At the same time, computer classes and users, programs and attendance, meeting room use and the number of library cardholders continue to grow.

## SITES WORTH VISITING

Here are a few Web sites we've come to admire at the Help Desk:

**American Memory** ([memory.loc.gov](http://memory.loc.gov)) - Part of the Library of Congress' presence on the Internet, American Memory includes more than 100 collections comprising millions of documents, photographs, and other items.

**Screen It! Entertainment Reviews** ([www.screenit.com](http://www.screenit.com)) For each movie the Screen It! crew reviews, they list just about everything that parents *might* not want their children to see or hear, and leave the judgement to you.

### Urban Legends Reference Page

([www.snopes.com](http://www.snopes.com)) - Before you forward that "true story" you got by email to everyone you know, *please* check it out here first.

**The Wayback Machine** ([www.archive.org](http://www.archive.org)) - Web sites can change daily and they sometimes disappear completely. The Internet Archive's Wayback Machine takes periodic snapshots of the Web, and it's your best chance of finding out what used to be on a site.

**Whichbook.net** ([www.whichbook.net](http://www.whichbook.net)) - Use either the slide controls or check boxes to select what you want in a book, and get a list of suggestions in return. It's based in the U.K., so don't bother clicking the "borrow" buttons. Also try the **NoveList** reader's advisory service in the Library's Online Reference Library (see article in this newsletter).

**The Word Spy** ([www.wordspy.com](http://www.wordspy.com)) - A dictionary of newly coined words and phrases, most of which you won't find in Webster's. Histories and references to published occurrences are included.

## THE NEW, IMPROVED ONLINE REFERENCE LIBRARY

Homer Township Library cardholders now have access to more resources through our Online Reference Library. From home, work, or anywhere else with Web access, all you need is your Library card number to use these products.

**NoveList** is an interactive tool to help you discover fiction books you might want to read. Look for authors or books that are similar to your favorites or find novels with a specific setting or plot. (New!)

**ReferenceUSA** is a nationwide directory of 14 million businesses and 140 million residential listings. Business listings include a contact person, annual sales data, parent and subsidiary links, credit risk assessment, and more. (New!)


**News Illinois** is an archive of selected articles from the Tribune, Sun-Times, wire services, and other news sources in the state. Coverage begins with 1997. (New!)

**LearnATest** is an interactive test preparation service. Practice online for SAT, ACT, GED, ASVAB, police, firefighter, paramedic, civil service, and real estate tests.

**ProQuest** is an archive of articles from thousands of magazines, journals, and other periodicals. Scanned images of many articles are available, so those printouts look similar to photocopies from the original publications. The simple interface makes ProQuest an excellent starting point for your research.

**Facts.com, FirstSearch, and SIRS Knowledge Source** round out the Online Reference Library. Each of these sources bring a unique selection of news articles, research reports, and other documents to your desktop. FirstSearch also includes WorldCat, an international catalog of library holdings.

Because the Online Reference Library is provided as part of your tax-funded Library service, there is no charge for you to use any of these resources. The Online Reference Library is on the Web at [www.homerlibrary.org/databases.html](http://www.homerlibrary.org/databases.html)



## GRANT MONEY AWARDED TO THE LIBRARY

For our tax-capped Library budget, grant awards are very important. In the past three years a total of 31 grants have been written, with 24 received funding. This has brought in approximately \$500,000 to the Library. These funds have provided programming, computers, and resources for our residents and allowed us to undertake several partnerships with our local school district and other community organizations. Library staff just submitted 8 additional grants which would provide assistive technology tools, and materials in the areas of art, antiques, parenting, and more. Funding examples:
