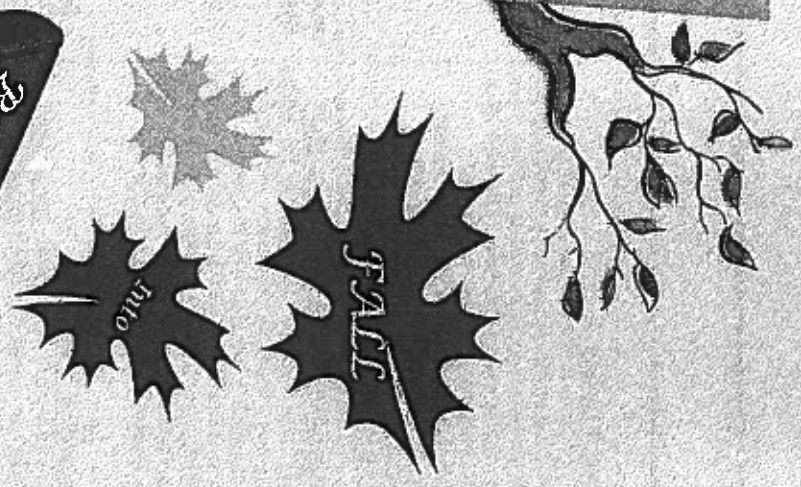


Lap Sit

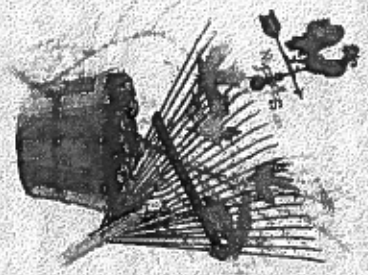
