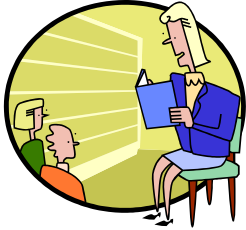


Story Hour

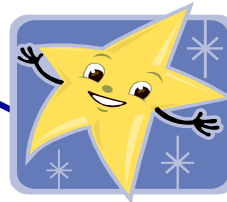


